## Important End of Year Information

### PROGRESSION WITH THE COLLEGE

In order to progress successfully to the next year of your course, you will need to meet the following expectations:

1. The expectation is that attendance to lessons (including English and Maths) is 95%. However, progression decisions will be based on whether a student is below the average College attendance (currently 90%).  
NB - we obviously consider students with serious health concerns or disabilities on an individual basis when making decisions based on attendance.
2. Good attendance at Entry Periods, to Passport Days, and FutureFest/independent study. Excellent attendance to your Work Experience placement if part of your course. You must also attend all of your exams.
3. At least a profile of Merits.
4. Positive behaviour for learning and safety.

Last year, 40 students did not meet these minimum standards and were not allowed back in for their second year.

Talk to your Personal Mentor if you are worried about any of these - there is still time to make a change and we want every student to succeed!

All offers of a place for next year will be conditional until your grades have been confirmed on 22 August 2019.

### END OF COURSE RESULTS AND ENROLMENT FOR NEXT YEAR

Your provisional results will be available from your subject teachers in June and we will be enrolling you on **26 June 2019** during the **Progression Passport Day**. As enrolment has to be done in person and you will not be fully enrolled until you have completed this Passport Day, please make sure you are available at this time. You will be sent a letter nearer the time with more details. We will be writing to your parent/guardian with information and a new Parent/Guardian Agreement. This must be brought, signed, to your Progression Passport Day in order to enrol.

Your certificates will be available late December 2019. More information will be available nearer the time.

If you are not enrolled onto a College place for next year, there will be help available on the day to help you find appropriate routes into work or further education training.

NB: Bursaries will continue until **mid-June 2019**.

### LAST LESSONS/LESSONS DURING JUNE

Your teacher will inform you of the final date for attendance to any lesson or workshop. Registers will be taken at classes up to this date and your bursary payment will be dependent upon your attendance.
