YOUR PLEDGE TO OUR COMMUNITY

All staff and students at Sir George Monoux College must follow our 3 Ps Positive Behaviours Framework. This document aims to help you understand these principles in a little more detail.

They are examples of the kind of behaviour we expect, which will help you to be successful and fulfil your potential whilst you are with us.



POSITIVE

- Be friendly and supportive of others including greeting each other.
- Use first names when talking to and about teachers and support staff.
- Act as a positive ambassador for the College. This includes with our neighbours, when on public transport, partner schools and the local community.
- Contribute positively to lessons and in interactions with others whilst on campus.
- Follow reasonable instructions from all members of staff.
- Treat everyone with respect and politeness and avoid using inappropriate language which may offend others.
- Respect the values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance for those with different faiths and beliefs.
- Wear your student ID card in its Pathway lanyard it means you are a valued part of our community!
- Take on board the feedback from your teachers, and use it to improve your work.

PLAN

- Attend all your lessons, Entry Periods and FutureFest sessions: we expect you to aim for 100% attendance and punctuality. Avoid taking holidays in term time.
- Be on time there is no excuse for lateness if students plan their day effectively.
- Be prepared for lessons by bringing the appropriate equipment and folder.
- Complete all coursework/assignments by agreed deadlines.
- Take responsibility to find out how to improve and confidently meet target grades.
- Notify the Student Information Centre staff if there is a change in your personal details, contact numbers or circumstances immediately.
- Follow the attached Dress Guidance and moderate your use of mobiles and earphones.

PROTECT

- Show respect for all members of the College community and behave at all times in a way which helps the College provide a safe, fair, clean and positive learning environment.
- Use the College's IT resources for appropriate educational activity and not for inappropriate or illegal activity as set out in the IT User Agreement.
- Communicate issues, emerging blocks to success and concerns to staff.
- Respect the right of all individuals to be free of harassment of any kind, whether sexual, racial or otherwise do not engage in any type of bullying or harassment.
- Do not bring on to the College site any alcohol, illegal substances or any item that could be seen as an offensive weapon.
- Respect the College environment, keeping it free of gum and litter, and smoking only in the smoking area. Seek permission from a member of staff before distributing any notices.
- Make sure your posts on social media are safe, always avoiding communications which bully, harass, pose a danger (e.g. of radicalisation), offend or harm.
- Assist security within the College by ensuring that hoods are not worn.
