We consider T Levels for entry to directly relevant degree courses only. We always require a Distinction overall but specific scores required in the core component and occupational specialism will vary by T Level and degree.



We are able to accept T Levels for entry into the majority of our undergraduate programmes, subject to grade and subject-specific requirements. Please see individual programme entry requirements for further details of acceptance criteria.



T Levels will be considered for entry on to the foundation year courses offered by our Lifelong Learning Centre. Some of our faculties will accept T Levels for entry on to undergraduate degrees – this is dependent on the T Level subject and the degree course.



For Nursing and Midwifery subjects only.



For non-clinical programmes, we will consider T-Levels in a relevant subject on a case-by-case basis, but may require further information to assess an application such as an interview.



The university accepts T-levels as equivalent to A-levels and considers applicants with T-Level qualifications, some courses may require additional qualifications to support meeting course specific requirements.



We can consider T-levels on a case-by-case basis, depending on subject studied and course applied for. If a T-level can be accepted, the offer for most of our undergraduate courses would be Distinction overall.
